As we look back at 2022 and reflect upon the important goals that we accomplished, we are reminded of how we got to where we are today. We imagined how we could continue to be guided by our mission to always consider the needs and demands of our community. We were inspired to grow and to provide more for our patients and families on Martha's Vineyard. After several years of planning and preparing to become hospice Medicare certified, that became a reality on September 30, 2022, along with accreditation through CHAP (Community Healthcare Accreditation Program), which requires a higher standard of care than Medicare.


Hospice and Palliative Care of Martha's Vineyard was founded 41 years ago, starting as a grassroots movement. Our offices then were housed in a trailer behind the hospital. We have come a long way from those humble beginnings. We are proud of our collective accomplishments over the years, providing not just hospice care to patients and family members, but palliative care services to those facing serious illness, and grief counseling to anyone on Martha's Vineyard suffering from a recent loss. The decision to become Medicare certified was to meet the responsibility we have to serve everyone in need of our compassionate care, and to deliver this care with the respect of patients' wishes and goals.

These achievements have been made possible through the generous support of our donors. Medicare certification does not change us nor define us. We are the same community nonprofit organization but now Medicare allows us to serve more hospice patients. We can serve anyone 65 or older wishing to access their Medicare Hospice benefit with enhancements that include coverage of medications, equipment, supplies, personal aide services and more. Our operations and staff have expanded, and all our staff live on Martha's Vineyard, making a big difference in our ability to care for our patients. Our interdisciplinary team includes nurses, counselors, social workers, administrators, nursing assistants, volunteers, a medical director, hospice physicians and office support staff, all highly qualified and committed to our work.



2022 EVENTS

Our **Supportive Care Team** held many workshops and groups throughout the year to support those experiencing loss in the community, including a 7-week **Making Meaning from Grief series** in January-February, a monthly **Men's Support Group**, a **Walking with Grief** 3-part series in October, and a virtual **Music & Memories Remembrance Event** in November.

The 28th Annual 5K Memorial Road Race was held in person in 2022 for the first time since the pandemic began. A virtual option was available, and as usual, we kicked off the day with our Kid's Fun Run! Over **350** people registered for the combined events and we were sponsored by **19** local businesses. The race raised over **\$26,000**.

Our annual **Summer Soirée** was a sold out event at Farm Neck Golf Club and raised a record breaking **\$284,000+** for HPCMV. The event was co-chaired by Liza May and Wiet Bachellor and included two silent auctions, a live auction, golden ticket sales, and a moving speech by Emily Coulter. Our many sponsors, volunteers and donors helped make this event a huge success!

The 12th Annual Hospice Golf Classic organized by Bud Lamoreaux took place in September and featured two rounds of golf, with **125** golfers and a luncheon, and raised a record breaking **\$100,000** for HPCMV from the golf registrations, tee sponsors, "Chance to Win" tickets and a silent auction.

We wrapped up the year in fundraising events with the beloved annual **Handmade From the Heart Holiday Sale** at the Daniel Fisher House at Christmas in Edgartown, which raised over **\$5,000**. Thank you to the artisans who donated goods for this sale.

Her aim is to be able to meet the patients' needs and wishes, make their days easier, and moments lighter. Hospice aides help patients with their activities of daily life, and is one of the many roles of Hospice which enable dignity in honoring the wishes of patients and their families.

The Importance of Getting Hospice Care Early

Our team at Hospice & Palliative Care of Martha's Vineyard was moved by the news in February 2023 that former US president Jimmy Carter had elected to enter Hospice care. We support the Carter family's decision to choose quality of life and comfort care rather than more aggressive curative approaches to his health. We're grateful this national story has brought to light the importance of choosing hospice *early* when facing goals about health care decisions.

One of the most common misconceptions about hospice care is that it should begin when there are likely just days or weeks left in a patient's life. Many people think of going on hospice as "giving up" or they fear that it will decrease lifespan, which are dangerous false perceptions. In fact, many who choose hospice care early tend to live longer and with a higher quality of life than those with similar diagnoses who do not have hospice care in place.

Electing hospice care is the best way to bring necessary support into the home or care facility for a patient facing end of life. Hospice care has been shown to decrease stress and improve care and comfort for patients and their families. The sooner the hospice team can participate in care of the patient and family, the longer they can take advantage of the added supports.

Hospice care provided by Hospice and Palliative Care of Martha's Vineyard includes:

- Nursing visits for case management
- Medication and symptom management, supervised by a medical doctor with oversight from a Doctor of Pharmacy
- Additional help with daily life activities from certified nursing assistants and volunteers
- Psychosocial and spiritual support from social workers and spiritual care counselors
- Anticipatory grief and bereavement counseling.

Our organization is here to assist anyone facing end-of-life decisions and wanting to learn more about accessing hospice and palliative services.

Why We Need Children's Bereavement Care Education

A Sister Remembers

It was a beautiful October day. My family had returned from church. We were getting ready after lunch to go to a kid's birthday party. Before leaving, my father asked me to mail some letters in the mailbox down the street; a ritual I often did for him. My six-year-old sister pestered my parents to come along. They reluctantly agreed.

The rest of the story is tragic. While coming back and crossing the street, a car in the distance hit the accelerator instead of braking and directly hit my sister. The next morning, despite brain surgery and efforts to save her, she died. What followed in my eyes as an eight-year-old, was seeing tremendous pain and anguish suffered by my parents, family, and community of friends. I found myself suddenly alone, despite some adults who wanted to help but had no idea how to connect with a little girl and her feelings about the loss.

In my adult years, I channeled my feelings about the loss I witnessed firsthand through educational opportunities and career choices that focused on helping others. This life event eventually led me into hospice work.

I believe the loss of a child is one of the most devastating, if not the most, to a parent. Children, whether losing a parent, sibling, grandparent, or another significant person, experience loss and grief deeply too. I have been a strong advocate for reaching out to children who are grieving and need to have their unspoken grief heard. I am most pleased that Hospice and Palliative Care of Martha's Vineyard is now adding children's bereavement to our counseling services.

We are extremely grateful to the **Martha's Vineyard Community Foundation** for awarding a grant to provide childhood bereavement training to further education of our counselors in this specialized area.

Thank you for allowing me to share my story. Grief is a forever thing. There isn't a day that goes by that I don't think of my sister.

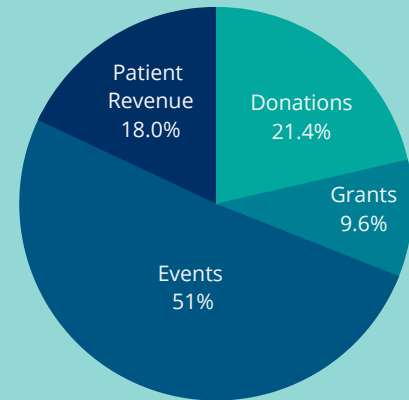

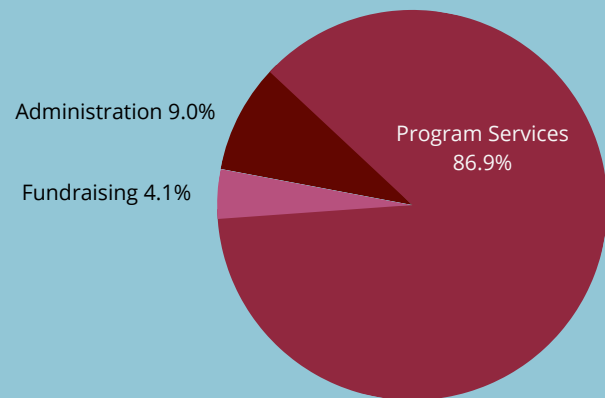

TREASURER'S NOTES

In September 2022, we achieved our significant undertaking of becoming an island-based-and-staffed Medicare-certified hospice accredited by Community Health Accreditation Partner (CHAP). We began billing for service in October and generated \$177,000 of patient revenues. We operated as if we were Medicare-certified throughout the year as mandated to allow the surveyors to test our regulatory required standards of practice and staffing levels before certifying us. Operating as if we were Medicare certified for three quarters without patient revenues contributed significantly to our operational shortfall. We expect our shortfall to decrease in 2023, with our patient census determining the magnitude of the decrease. Our non-patient revenue decreased slightly for the year, with events (Soirée, Golf Tournament) up considerably but more than offset by decreases in grants and donations. In early 2022, we moved \$2 million out of marketable securities into money market funds to fund the anticipated losses and mute the effect of a volatile market. Our investments decreased \$1,650,000 to fund operations and \$930,000 associated with market performance – a 13.5% decrease from the opening balance. *-Alfred Woollacott III, Board Treasurer*
